Harvest Donations

Our Harvest Thanksgiving Service will be on **Thursday 3rd October** at 9:30am across in the church. Parents are invited to join us in the church, but if you have a child in Van Gogh Class we would be grateful for your support in walking with the children to the church – just 1 adult per child please to be at school for 9:20am if possible. All other adults can meet us at the church!



Donations again this year will be taken to the Salvation Army's Kings Ripton Court in Huntingdon. Kings Ripton Court is a Salvation Army Lifehouse based in Huntingdon that supports young people aged 16-25 years, experiencing homelessness.

Through your generosity in donating food produce, they are able to provide new residents with a food parcel on arrival as part of their 'welcome pack' so that they can focus on settling in during their first few days. Donations also enable the team to provide emergency food provision to any residents who may be struggling financially and also use the produce as part of their Lifeskills Programme which helps the young people develop skills needed for independent living.

They would particularly appreciate donations of drinking squash, dried pasta, rice, long life milk and tinned food (e.g. tuna). Donations can be brought into school from Tuesday via your child. Sadly they are unable to accept any fresh produce.

Screening for Diabetes study

Thank you to everyone who has already signed up to take part in the diabetes study as mentioned in the last newsletter. We have been given the opportunity to offer all children here at school an early screening test for type 1 diabetes. This testing programme hopes to identify diabetes in children early in order for treatment to be started sooner. All information is in the letters which have been emailed today as well as details of how to register. The screening will take place at school on Tuesday 22nd October but if interested please do sign up before 15th October.
